Has your family lost Minnesota Medical Assistance (Medicaid) health insurance?

There's still time to get coverage back.



Minnesota Medical Assistance renewals are happening quickly. If you, your children, or other members of your household have lost coverage through Minnesota Medical Assistance, you may actually still be eligible. Know your options for free or low-cost health coverage.

MINNESOTA MEDICAL ASSISTANCE ELIGIBILITY

- Individuals: \$20,120/year
- Adults in families of 4: \$41,400/year
- Infants ages 0–1 in families of 4: \$86,400/year
- Children ages 1–18 in families of 4: \$84,000/year

Your children may be eligible for coverage even if you aren't!

- If you believe you or your children are still eligible, contact Minnesota Medical Assistance by visiting https://mn.gov/dhs/mycontactinfo/ or calling 800-657-3672. You can have your case reconsidered, appeal, or reapply for Minnesota Medical Assistance.
- Even if you do not think you're eligible, your children may be. It's still important to return all forms as soon as possible. The state can reconsider your case if you turn in your paperwork, even if it's after the deadline.
- Most children should remain eligible for MinnesotaCare (CHIP). If your child has lost Medicaid, contact MinnesotaCare at 651-297-3862 to check eligibility and enroll.
- If you or your child are no longer eligible for Medicaid and/or CHIP, you may be able to enroll your family in a quality low-cost plan through MNSure. Visit <u>https://www.mnsure.org</u> or call 855-366-7873 to get coverage beginning the first of next month.
