### **Recruiting Now: Faculty for Disaster Management for CYSHCN ECHO Series**

The AAP is seeking subject matter experts to serve as faculty for an upcoming ECHO (Extension for Community Health Outreach) series that will address the specific needs of children and youth with special health care needs (CYSHCN) in disaster management efforts. The Disaster Management for CYSHCN ECHO will begin in November 2022 and will consist of 6 sessions. Tentative session topics include:

- The Why: Experiences of Families of CYSHCN During Disasters
- Specific Considerations for Families with CYSHCN in the Preparedness Phase
- Specific Considerations for Families with CYSHCN in the Response Phase
- Working with Families with CYSHCN in Rural Communities
- Learning from Partners: National and Local Organizations Serving Families
- Improving Disaster Management Strategies for CYSHCN in Your Setting

These 6, 1-hour sessions will be held every 2 weeks from November 2022 through January 2023. Faculty will be expected to attend a faculty onboarding training and each ECHO session, including a 15-minute huddle prior to each session and a 15-minute de-brief following each session. A stipend will be provided.

Recruiting Now – AAP Infection Prevention and Control Quality Improvement ECHO! The American Academy of Pediatrics is recruiting primary care practice teams to join a 3-month learning collaborative aimed at improving knowledge, skills and self-efficacy around infection prevention and control strategies.
