

AAP Systems of Care for Healthy Mental Development ECHO!

The American Academy of Pediatrics is recruiting primary care practices, AAP members, behavioral/mental health providers, and other collaborators to join an 8-month learning collaborative aimed to build capacity for systems of care to support healthy mental development for pediatric patients and their families.

This ECHO will have a quality improvement (QI) component. Practices/organizations who wish to participate in the QI component must provide primary care to patients 0-12 years, complete monthly de-identified retrospective chart reviews, and submit a monthly PDSA (plan Do, Study, Act) worksheet.

Practices will engage in the ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) model™, a telementoring platform that leverages video conference technology to connect subject matter experts with primary care teams in local communities, fostering an “**all teach, all learn**” approach.


Benefits of participating:
