#### **Connecting Families to Community Resources**

Resources and services are often available in the local community to help families with basic needs such as food, housing, utilities, and temporary financial assistance. The following template is a tool for practices to begin identifying the local resources that are available in their local community, for making family referrals.

The template includes example questions that can be asked, when discussing basic needs with families.

When completing the template, practices can prioritize which categories to complete, based on their local community and practice needs.

Links to national and state resources are provided to help assist with finding local resources. These resources may not be available in every community.

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#### **Example Questions**

- Do you ever have a time when you don't have enough food?
- Do you have WIC? Do you have Food stamps?
- Do you need help in getting food by the end of the month?
- In the last year, did the food you bought just not last and you didn't have money to get more?
