

SOCC 2020 Distinguished Career Award News

The prestigious SOCC Distinguished Career Award for 2020 goes to **Edward E. Conway Jr, MD, MS, FAAP, FCCM.** The award is being announced now but will be presented in person during the AAP National Conference in Philadelphia in October 2021.

Dr Conway is Chief of Pediatric Critical Care Medicine and Vice-Chairman of the Lewis M. Fraad Department of Pediatrics at Jacobi Medical Center, Bronx, New York. He is a member of the Section on Critical Care, Section on Emergency Medicine, Council on Child Abuse and Neglect, and Council on Injury, Violence, and Poison Prevention.

Dr Conway received his BS at Manhattan College



and an MS in Cell Biology at Fordham University. He attended SUNY Downstate College of Medicine where he received his MD degree. He then completed his internship, residency, chief residency and Pediatric Critical Care Fellowship at the Children's Hospital at Montefiore and the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. He has authored over 160 abstracts, papers, and book chapters on a myriad of pediatric topics involving critically ill children. Dr Conway is the immediate-past Chairman of the AAP Section on Critical Care Executive Committee and a current member of the Board of Regents for the American College of Critical Care Medicine of the Society of Critical Care Medicine. He is currently a senior member of the NYCDOH Pediatric Disaster Preparedness Committee and NYSDOH Emergency Medicine Services for Children Committee. He has served as an advisor to the NYSDOH Advisory Board and Greater New York Hospital Association for Pediatric Sepsis and a contributor to the recently published guideline entitled Hemodynamic Management of Pediatric Sepsis. His particular areas of interest include PCCM education, simulation, pediatric head injury, and sepsis.

AAP SOCC continues to be busy at work on policies that impact the work we do in pediatric critical care medicine. Currently, two policies are being actively composed: Pediatric Organ Donation & Transplantation and updated Guidelines for the Pediatric Intermediate Care Unit. Both policies are multi-

disciplinary, pulling experts from hospital medicine and surgery, among others. Lastly, SOCC has also been recently asked to join an intent for potential development of an AAP policy on Pediatric Non-Traumatic Cardiac Arrest that is currently put forth by the Committee on Pediatric Emergency Medicine. More updates in the coming months!

Regarding COVID-19, SOCC (in representing the American Academy of Pediatrics) was recently invited to participate on the SCCM's upcoming conference "COVID-19: Preparing for the Second Wave" set for 9/11-12. This conference is sponsored by several medical societies in addition to the AAP including the American Academy of Emergency Medicine, American College of Chest Physicians, American College of Physicians, American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, and American Society of Anesthesiologists. This conference will be headlined by Dr Fauci who will be delivering the opening plenary. AAP will have 4 sessions including topics on MIS-C, Adults in the ICU, Maintaining Sanity/Safety in Chaos, and Matching Science to Uncertainty. Don't forget to register! As a follow up to last year's joint 2019 AAP-SCCM publication, "<u>Criteria for</u> <u>Critical Care of Infants and Children: PICU Admission, Discharge, and</u> <u>Triage Practice Statement and Levels of Care Guidance</u>," a multidisciplinary group is now actively engaged in the revision of the official AAP Intermediate Care Unit guidelines (last version published in 2004). Participants from the AAP SOCC include Drs Nick Ettinger (lead author), Benson Hsu and Michael Agus. Other author participants include representation from the AAP Section on Hospital Medicine and the AAP Section on Surgery.

As COVID-19 spread across the country, we were in excellent position to leverage our online network, PC3N (Pediatric Critical Care Chiefs Network) to help support PICU leadership to learn from one another. We quickly expanded the network to include Medical Directors, in addition to Division Chiefs and Directors, and saw dozens of exchanges about PPE, testing,

treatment, and then MIS-C. While we did not have pandemic response as part of the founding principles, it became obvious that the need to share information and learn from one another in real time is an imperative in our field. PICU leaders from across the US were grateful for the SOCC's prescient investment in the establishment of this network.

AAP Offers Interim Guidance on Multi-System Inflammatory Syndrome in Children

In July, the AAP published <u>interim clinical guidance on Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome</u> in Children (MIS-C). The recommendations offer pediatricians guidance on the signs, symptoms, diagnosis, and management of this rare but serious complication associated with COVID-19.
