

Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (SUID) Prevention Program Learning Community

The SUID Prevention Program Learning Community was established to increase understanding of fatality review and the importance of data when informing SUID prevention activities.

This cross-discipline Learning Community aims to:

- Increase understanding of fatality review systems and their potential impact for prevention.
- Bridge evidence-informed best practice recommendations and implementation to provide focused, impactful education to multidisciplinary audiences.
- Build upon existing safe sleep resources and initiatives with a focus on supporting practice and organizational change among communities experiencing the highest rates of SUID.
- Encourage utilization of fatality review systems to improve community engagement and inform SUID prevention efforts.

This 4-part webinar series will include didactic sessions followed by group discussion to facilitate peer-to-peer learning.
