Session 1: Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders: Screening, Assessment, and Diagnosis

Faculty: Prachi Shah, MD, FAAP

Brief Description: This webinar will focus on describing the diagnostic criteria for conditions along the continuum of FASD, understanding the differential diagnoses of FASD, recognizing the neurodevelopmental phenotype associated with prenatal alcohol exposure (PAE), and explaining the importance of screening all patients for a history of PAE. Participants will be oriented to the diagnostic assessment, including the areas of the brain affected by prenatal alcohol exposure, approaches to delivering the diagnosis, and indications for referral. Faculty will reinforce the benefits of assessing for PAE and delivering an FASD diagnosis. Session 2: Overcoming Social Attitudes as a Barrier to Early Identification of FASD

Brief Description: Session 2 will define the role that social attitudes have in early identification of children with an FASD. Faculty will demonstrate how to address issues around stigma and bias in assessing for and delivering an FASD diagnosis and share lived experience to illustrate best practices regarding shame. Participants will learn the importance of screening for prenatal alcohol exposure and providing family-centered care as part of the pediatric medical home. Faculty will discuss the importance of an FASD diagnosis for treatment and interventions. Session 3: Treatment Across the Lifespan for Persons with FASD

Brief Description: This webinar will provide primary care clinicians with the tools they need to treat children with an FASD across the lifespan. The session will focus on identifying and managing neurobehavioral and medical concerns at different developmental stages. Participants will learn about medical, therapeutic, and pharmaceutical considerations. Faculty will present evidence-based interventions that are applicable to community-based primary care pediatricians and discuss approaches to building parent knowledge and working with the school system to access services through individualized education programs (IEPs) and 504 Plans. Support services and resources for providers, families, and teachers/schools will also be covered. Session 4: Neurobehavioral Disorder Associated with Prenatal Alcohol Exposure (ND-PAE)

Brief Description: This webinar will focus on the factors in a patient's medical history and clinical presentation that may indicate the presence of Neurobehavioral Disorder Associated with Prenatal Alcohol Exposure (ND-PAE). Faculty will review the definition of ND-PAE from the 5th edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM-5). Participants will learn about the three domains in which children with this disorder struggle with behavior and developmental tasks and how ND-PAE may present in clinic through the developmental stages.
