



## Call for Interest: NRP® Steering Committee Membership

The Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) Steering Committee is comprised of a multidisciplinary group of general members, liaisons and consultants who coordinate, develop, and implement educational materials to promote evidence-based newborn resuscitation.

The NRP Steering Committee works closely with AAP staff to develop resources and policies based on current science and educational methodology for the Neonatal Resuscitation Program.

The NRP Steering Committee currently includes the following members:

- 10 Academy members/neonatologists (6 general members, 1 community provider member, 1 nurse educator member, 2 cochairs)

  - Canadian Pediatric Society (CPS)

  - American Association for Respiratory Care (AARC)
  - AAP Committee on Fetus and Newborn (COFN)
  - AAP Section on Hospital Medicine (SoHM)
  - AAP Section on Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine (SoNPM)
- 7 consultants, including the editors of the *Textbook of Neonatal Resuscitation*, NRP Instructor Toolkit, and the ILCOR Neonatal Task Force lead.

The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) is looking for **3 AAP Members** to serve as general members on the NRP Steering Committee. A member of the committee can serve up to a total of 10 years. The 10 years are divided into 2 three-year terms as a committee member with a potential addition of 2 two-year terms as a committee co-chair.

The ideal candidate is a(n):

- Fellow in good standing of the American Academy of Pediatrics
- Practicing neonatologist in a hospital setting
- Active NRP Instructor in good standing
- Expert in the science, educational methods, and/or quality improvement involving neonatal resuscitation

Steering Committee members will be required to:

- Attend committee meetings in the spring (AAP Headquarters in Itasca, IL) and fall at location TBD
- Prepare evidence evaluation worksheets and participate in the evidence review process
- Contribute to development of NRP publications and courseware
- Review research grant applications

- Participate in the annual NRP educational seminar
- Serve on subcommittee workgroups
