Saroj Saigal, MD, FRCP(C)



Dr. Saroj Saigal obtained her medical degree and pediatric training in India and completed her neonatal fellowship at the Universities of Edinburgh, McGill, and McMaster. In 1972, she joined the pediatric faculty at McMaster University as a neonatologist in the newly opened Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. She founded the Neonatal Follow-up Program for high-risk infants, one of few such programs in the country at the time, and was the Medical Director until 2013. Since 1984, Dr. Saigal has been a Professor of Pediatrics and is currently Professor Emerita at

McMaster University. She continues to run the follow-up clinic, as well as her ongoing research and publications.

Dr. Saigal and her colleagues have followed one of the few population-based cohorts of extremely low birthweight infants longitudinally from infancy to adulthood, and in 2011, she co-founded the Adult Born Preterm International Collaboration (APIC). She is internationally recognized for her studies which focus on the quality of life and consequences of having been born extremely prematurely and has received numerous awards for her substantive contributions to perinatal and pediatric healthcare research.
