## WHAT IS THE TRAUMA-INFORMED PEDIATRIC PROVIDER COURSE?

Many children and youth are exposed to trauma and adverse experiences that, if left unaddressed, can lead to toxic stress and other issues that affect lifelong health, wellness and development.
