## COURSE DESCRIPTION

The American Academy of Pediatrics will be sponsoring a course that will address all aspects of HIV management in infants, children, adolescents and young persons; and to present evidence-based data to optimize clinical practice. The course is intended for individuals that are interested in expanding their knowledge in HIV/AIDS care.

## LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Proficient in managing the infant exposed perinatally to HIV.
2. Able to provide recommendations on when to start antiretroviral therapy in the HIV-infected child/adolescent/young persons, and demonstrate knowledge of the individual drugs including toxicities and interactions.
3. Able to manage the many opportunistic infections and sexually transmitted infections associated with HIV infection.
4. Knowledgeable about the complexities and challenges of HIV care in adolescents/ young persons including disclosure, adherence, and sexual behaviour, and be able to formulate individual management plans.
