Chapter Telehealth Grant Opportunity

Call for Proposals

The purpose of this award is to offer grants of up to \$25,000 to AAP Chapters interested in implementing a project that supports improved access to the medical home model of care through the use of telehealth for children, adolescents, and their families. The grant will support AAP Chapters with telehealth and distance care project activities for their members. Program awardees will participate from **September 2021- February 2022.**

This chapter grants project is being made available through the "Supporting Providers and Families to Access Telehealth and Distant Care Services for Pediatric Care" project. This project is a grant between the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and the Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB) in the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). The goal of this grant is to support telehealth access and infrastructure for the provision of comprehensive care to children and adolescents, including children and youth with special health care needs (CYSHCN) and other vulnerable pediatric populations, utilizing a medical home approach during and after the COVID-19 pandemic.

Applicant Requirements and Processes:

- Applicants should demonstrate a need in the state or territory related to telehealth implementation, expansion, and/or sustainability in alignment with the medical home approach to care.
- Preference will be given to Chapter projects that focus on health equity in alignment with the <u>AAP Equity Agenda</u>. This could include project proposals that are inclusive of the telehealth needs of underserved communities and populations.
 - o For the purpose of this project, underserved is defined as any population where health disparities are seen and where telehealth can help improve access to care and address those disparities.
 - To further support equity efforts, chapters are strongly encouraged to partner with families/caregivers, young adults, and others with lived experiences throughout their project efforts with appropriate compensation (see sample budget for more details).
- Preference will be given to Chapters who are supporting their members in activities related to:
 - o Mental/behavioral health care delivered via telehealth
 - o Care for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) delivered via telehealth
- Proposals can fall into any of the 4 tiers and must be for the full tier amount. AAP staff will be available to work with Chapters to determine which tier that proposal best fits into and in connecting Chapters to AAP staff that can further support them in their project activities. Below is a list of suggested activities that could fall under the scope of each budget; however, chapters are not limited to these suggested activities and are welcome to propose their own initiatives based on the needs of their members and communities.
 - o Tier 1: \$5000
 - Education session (webinars, office hours, podcasts, roundtables)

- Telehealth guest speaker series
- Creation and/or support of an existing subcommittee focused on telehealth at the chapter level
- Creation and/or development of resources for families/caregivers

Tier 2: \$10,000

- Visiting professorship
- Telehealth guest speaker series
- Creation and/or support of an existing subcommittee focused on telehealth at the chapter level
- Creation and/or development of resources for families/caregivers

o Tier 3: \$15,000

- Any activities from Tier 1 or Tier 2
- Education session at annual meeting/ conference
- Quality improvement project
 - Stipend for practices/practitioners participating
- ECHO Project including CME credits
 - For Chapters that are already an ECHO hub

o Tier 4: \$25,000

- 1-day virtual conference on telehealth education/training
- Quality improvement project
 - Stipend for practices/practitioners participating
- ECHO Project including CME credits and potentially MOC4 credit (if interested)
 - For Chapters that are already an ECHO hub

- **OPTIONAL:** Conduct a needs assessment of chapter members to identify telehealth gaps if such an assessment has not already been done by the Chapter. **While this activity is optional**, we strongly encourage this for chapters that have not conducted a needs assessment of members related to telehealth.
 - o A needs assessment survey and link to be provided by AAP
 - The survey can help with narrowing down topics of interest among members related to telehealth implementation, expansion, and/or sustainability and help inform Chapter project proposals and the focus of educational content.
 - If chapters distribute this survey and plan to disseminate findings through publications or presentation, Institutional Review Board (IRB) may be required. Please consultant your local IRB or contact the AAP staff team for more information.
- Launch a program/project that offers opportunities related to telehealth education to chapter members no later than September 2021.
 - AAP has a number of telehealth education resources that chapters can use and/or reference for this
 opportunity. (See Appendix C for list of available presentation topics and Appendix D for publicly
 available AAP telehealth resources)
- Participate in recurring monthly calls with the national AAP project team and provide regular progress reports.
- Explore collaborations and partnerships opportunities including but not limited to the following: (AAP staff will be available to facilitate connections as needed)
 - o Connections with state or territory <u>Family-to-Family Health Information Centers.</u>
 - Connections with state <u>Title V Programs</u>.
 - Psychiatry Access Programs
 - National Network of Child Psychiatry Access Programs (NNCPAP)
 - Pediatric Mental Health Access Programs
 - O Collaboration with National Rural Health Association (NRHA) state associations.
 - o Connections to National Consortium of Telehealth Resource Centers.
- Submit a final report to AAP within 1 month of grant ending to share promising practices and lessons learned. (Template will be provided)

ADDITIONAL GUIDANCE

Unallowable expenses:

- Funds cannot be used for any activities related to advocacy, since funds come from a federal grant
- Construction
- Capital equipment and/or expenses (i.e., rent, office equipment, computer software)
- Equipment including computers, projectors, and speakers
- Existing program activities
- Supplemental funding to previously awarded grants

Grant money is limited in the following areas for educational programs:

- Maximum speaker honoraria = \$1,000/speaker
- Maximum travel expenses (airfare, ground transportation, etc.) = \$700/speaker
- Food and beverage cannot exceed \$125 per attendee, per day
- Space rental cannot exceed \$250 per day
- Audio visual cannot exceed \$250 per day
- Marketing and distribution cannot exceed \$5 per attendee

 The AAP is recommending \$25/hour as suggested compensation if providing honorariums to any families/caregivers and or young adults that might be partnering with your chapter in your project
